

STATEMENT OF TUTION ASSURANCE

Purpose	This procedure has been developed to ensure that MIMT has appropriate Tuition Assurance arrangements in place.

Responsibility for implementation	The Campus Manager is responsible for ensuring that MIMT maintains current Tuition Assurance coverage at all times.

Policy/ Process	Australian College of Health and Fitness Pty Ltd ABN: 43 123 508 305 ACN: 123 508 305 (the first provider) must comply with Tuition Assurance requirements. This is to protect students in the event that MIMT cease to provide a VET course of study for which a student is enrolled. MIMT meet the Tuition Assurance requirements, as specified in the VET Student Loans Rules 2016 through current membership with the Australian Council for Private Education and Training (ACPET) (the Scheme). The contact details for ACPET are as follows: Membership Administrator Website: www.acpet.edu.au Email: membership@acpet.edu.au Phone number: 03 9416 1895 In the event that MIMT cease to provide an approved course before it is completed, the tuition assurance scheme will offer affected students a replacement course. The replacement course must meet the relevant tuition assurance arrangements to be offered as a replacement course i.e. is the same course that the student was originally enrolled, be on the approved course list and so forth. A student may seek review of a decision about whether or not a course is a replacement course that meets those requirements. A student who accepts the offer of a replacement course: (i) Will not be required to pay the replacement provider for the replacement components of the replacement course by presenting verifiable documents to confirm that the student has successfully components of the course Students need to be aware that the tuition fees for the remainder of the replacement course may be different from the fees payable for the original course. This information will need to be discussed between the student and
	replacement provider. The student will have a period of 6 months in which to accept the offer for a replacement course. Where applicable, ACPET may extend that period of 6



months in circumstances that justify the extension.

If there is no suitable replacement course for a student, the student's FEE-HELP balance will be re-credited for the affected parts of the original course.

If the student enrols in a course that is not a replacement course, the student:

- (i) May be required to pay additional tuition fees; and
- (ii) Might not receive the course credits the student would have received if the student had enrolled in a replacement course
